The Metro agreement was ratified by the Rona Membership on Thursday, December 27, 2018 with 100% in agreement. We are still waiting for a signing date from Rona/Lowe's.

They can provide alternatives to bankruptcy and will advocate with creditors and others seeking concessions on interest charges, reduced monthly payments and a no repossession or legal action understanding with banks and other financial institutions.
