New OAWA Office now open at 1000 Sackville Drive

The Office to Advance Women Apprentices – Nova Scotia located at 1000 Sackville Drive is an innovative approach to enhance entry, advancement and completion outcomes for women in the apprenticeable skilled construction trades in the province. This Office is being replicated from the Office to Advance Women Apprentices model in Newfoundland & Labrador which was created by Carpenters Local 579 and has been in operation for ten years. The Nova Scotia Office operates under the direction of Canada's Building Trades Unions (CBTU) and is funded through the Federal government's Union Training and Innovation Program (UTIP) with

significant in-kind contributions from Atlantic Regional Council of Carpenter, Millwrights and Allied Workers. ACRC has received federal funding under the Women in Construction Fund to roll out this Office model in New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island which will open in early October. These Offices will provide services to allow women to become ready for good jobs in trades, build better lives for themselves and make their communities stronger.
