As the government of Nova Scotia continues to invest in infrastructure, more and more projects are taking shape. The 2019-2020 Capital Budget announced there would be \$35.2 million for construction, repair and renewal of the hospitals and medical facilities in Nova Scotia, supporting the largest healthcare redevelopment projects in this province's history. We are already seeing the new primary health care facility taking shape in Middleton (Lindsay Construction). \$63.1 million was announced for school design and construction, the new J.L. Isley High School has already broken ground in Spryfield (Able Equipment). These are just a few of the many upcoming projects that will increase the demand of skilled workers in our sec-

With this boom on the horizon, I want to encourage you to maintain communication with the Union Hall and ensure your work status and training are up to date. If you know skilled workers who are interested in joining us, be sure to promote our growth and help us build our workforce to accommodate this upcoming busy season .

Local 83 Welcomes Caper Developments Ltd!

January 2020 brought a number of new contractors to Local 83, we'd like to offer a big welcome to all our new signatory contractors. Caper Developments is a locally owned and operated company in Antigonish. They currently employ upwards of 35 skilled workers and with many ongoing and upcoming projects are looking to grow their workforce. Currently, they have four commercial projects underway as well as many duplexes. Caper Developments offers both commer-

Update: Goldboro LNG in Nova Scotia



A \$16 million development expense budget will keep alive in 2020 the delayed plan to export natural gas from Canada's Atlantic coast via the Goldboro terminal in Nova Scotia, according to project sponsor Pieridae Energy Ltd.

The company said it remains committed to its latest stated target to

reach a final investment decision in 2020 about whether to build the liquefied natural gas (LNG) terminal Goldboro LNG for tanker deliveries to Europe.

Pieridae's 2020 targets include finalizing a construction contract with engineering conglomerate KBR and a multibillion-dollar loan guarantee sought from the German government. Pieridae has worked to secure a\$1.5 billion loan guarantee from a clean fuel incentive program. The current timeline targets commercial deliveries starting November 30, 2024 and May 31, 2025.

COMMUNITY BENEFITS PROGRAMS

With \$5-8 billion in public infrastructure investments planned for Nova Scotia, there is a unique opportunity to enact "Best Value Procurement", of which community benefits is one component. Our last article focused on the benefits that a Community Benefit Agreement would bring to members of Local 83. The Council will continue to advocate for this while finding community partners who share in the belief of best value procurement.
