Local 579 Pension Plan Update

Last week we held a second Tele-Town Hall to inform members of Local 579 about recent changes to the pension plan.

Members were informed of the recent transfer of pension plan administration from Belmont to Manion Wilkins effective January 1, 2021. Further measures were also taken to address the unfunded liability of the plan with the benefit rate changing from 1.9% to 1.25%.

In the past, a member contributed 0.75 from every pension hourly contribution with the remaining being credited to the member's pension. On a go forward basis, the total pension hourly contribution will be credited to the member's pension. These changes will not affect anyone currently on pension or any contributions made to the plan up to and including December 31, 2020.


