The Local 83 Executive looks forward to serving the membership over the next three years.

There are plenty of approved and /or Underway Projects in Nova Scotia. Some of these projects include:

- Halifax Shipyard Contract- Combat Vessels- 60 billion- Beginning in 2024-2044
- Halifax Infirmary Expansion- 1.5 billion Ellis Don and PCL have been shortlisted. The deadline for proposals is Fall 2021; the successful bidder will be announced Spring 2022.
- QE2 Parkade- 29 million- 500 Spot parkade next to the Museum of Natural History. This went to Lindsay Construction. The overall cost of the QE2 Redevelopment Project is expected to be 2 billion.
- Halifax four-year capital Budget- 837 million- 2021-2025. Spending was cut back last year due to COVID-19. Spending this year will total 178 million, including 61 million for road, bridges, and active transportation. 35 million for buildings, 43 million for vehicles, vessels, and equipment.
- Frigate upgrades- 500 million- 2022-2027. Irving Shipyards was awarded a contract in August 2019 to carry out maintenance work on the Halifax Frigates.
- Kings Wharf Waterfront Development, Dartmouth- 500 million- 2010-2030. Future phases will involve commercial, retail, and residential construction according to market demand.
- Highway 104 Twinning- 364 million 2020-2023. The province announced plans to twin 38kms of highway 104 between Sutherland's River and Antigonish. All overpass bridge work will be done by Able Equipment.
- Kiln Creek, Lantz- 260 million- 2020-2028. Clayton Development is planning a new community in Lantz with up to 1,500 residential units and 4 commercial buildings.








ACRC 10th Anniversary Month!
