We have continued to offer all of the necessary upgrade and skills training to our members throughout this Pandemic, and we want to thank our members, high school groups, and other partners for adhering to our strict Covid protocols as we move into 2022, following our masking, sanitation, and distancing rules, we thank

2022 will be a year of growth and building. We have an increased emphasis on the importance of becoming a Registered Apprentice, attending apprenticeship training, and on achieving your Certified Red Seal Carpenter status. We are offering an ONLINE RED SEAL EXAM preparation program and are proud to report that we have 4 new Red Seal Certified members that achieved this before the end of 2021 and are currently running a group of members every Saturday and Sunday (6 Days) through January, to write their Red Seal Exam in February. This is a very important step forward, as new provincial projects in the province will be looking for registered apprentices, as well as certified Journeyperson Carpenters. Stay tuned and call the CMCNS at 902 252 3553 to get your name on the waitlist and see if you qualify for the next intake. This interactive classroom instructor led program is 100% Online, with a required pre-study component, please contact our office for more details.

All regular safety certification classes are continually offered, and we are also continuing to offer 4 days of training in Stellarton each month, one day Forklift Operator, Fall Pro, Confined Space, and Mobile Elevated Work Platform. We have started another 12-week Carpenter Development Program Jan 10 at our headquarters in Lower Sackville, and we will be looking for MORE students in the coming months to take part in exciting new 5-week programs being developed in Concrete Formwork and Interior Systems (Drywall installation). Contact us at 902 252 3553 to add your name to wait lists for these and any other programs as soon as you can, as they will fill up fast.

Be sure you look at your training records regularly through your Training Verification Card (TVC) QR code on your Training card, and make sure you are not expired and are up to date on any of your necessary certifications for the jobsite.
